Main Street Skowhegan Launches Technical Assistance Grants for Entrepreneurs

Skowhegan, Maine——Representatives from Main Street Skowhegan announced Thursday that they are launching a technical assistance (TA) grant program to support and grow Skowhegan businesses.

A project of Main Street Skowhegan's Business Enhancement Committee, the TA grant program will consist of mini-grants ranging from \$500 to \$2,000, awarded to fund need-based technical assistance and equipment. All current Skowhegan business owners and entrepreneurs who plan to start a business in Skowhegan are eligible to apply.

"We are excited to unveil a new technical assistance grant program that will help new and existing businesses grow in the Skowhegan area," said Sam Hight, chair of Main Street Skowhegan's Business Enhancement Committee. "Skowhegan is currently experiencing a positive entrepreneurial movement, and we are excited to play a supportive role."

Hight added, "Main Street's Business Enhancement Committee has partnered with local lending institutions—Skowhegan Savings Bank, Franklin Savings Bank, New Dimensions Federal Credit Union, and Franklin-Somerset Federal Credit Union—who have not only funded our grant program but who have also joined our committee to better facilitate future business growth in Skowhegan."

Examples of grant-eligible technical assistance projects include, but are not limited to, hiring a professional to help with marketing, brand identity, or web development; attending a course or mentoring opportunity; hiring an architect, engineer, business advisor, or other specialist; buying a needed piece of machinery; or obtaining legal support.
